

A tough couple of years


ack in the spring of 2020 we had taken delivery of our annual *Ohio Bicycle Events Calendar* portraying a season full of the promise of fun and adventure on two wheels. The cover was beautiful — a painting by the late Mike Hill — showed a group of recreational cyclists heading out on a ride from a city street corner.



Then COVID-19 exploded across America impacting nearly every aspect of daily life, sickening and killing multitudes. Just as circulation of our 2020 edition was beginning, it was halted. Bicycle shops closed. Rides were canceled. The cycling season was decimated. Ultimately, unless you're riding a tandem, bicycling is a solitary outdoor sport. Individuals could safely bike on their own. Families could enjoy fresh air and sunshine. So long they we kept to themselves. No big groups. No big rides.

By 2021 we were learning how to cope with COVID as its nature and mode of transmission became known. Vaccines came on the scene significantly reducing the risk of contracting the illness. There were still many restrictions. The Calendar, or OBEC as we sometimes call it, is researched late in the year and assembled early in its year of publication. In December 2020 fully 50 percent of ride organizers were uncertain or were unable to host their 2021 events. Given that high degree of uncertainly, we elected not to print a 2021 OBEC. Instead of ink, we relied upon electrons in the form of our website — publishing online only. A nostalgic painting by Gay Freeborn graced the site's homepage. We listed in-person and "virtual" cycling events as we learned of them and assembled a

printable Calendar for archival purposes at the end of the season.



So here we are. COVID-19 is still with us in 2022 but we're better prepared. We know how to avoid contact, we have effective vaccines, and in February we are seeing a hopeful drop in disease transmission. Happily the number of event listings in this year's OBEC has nearly returned to normal.

Through good times and bad, since 1984 the Calendar has been published annually. We're proud of the OBEC and hope it has been of service as a guide to both bicycle event hosts and cyclists.

Take a look at this year's listings, allow yourself to be excited, then get on your bikes and ride!

Touring Events

Tours are noncompetitive group rides for cyclists of various ages and abilities. Tour organizers (usually bicycle clubs) normally charge a modest fee to cover services provided.

Budget tours and free rides usually offer few, if any, services – after all,, they're cheap or free!

Full-service tours, however, typically offer a map and/or GPS data, food stops, and road ("SAG") assistance and cost a bit more to cover expenses. Multi-day events provide additional services. Fundraisers may have higher entry fees to provide income for their causes. Events that are "bike-a-thons" or "pledge rides" may or may not be operated by or in association with a bicycle organization and fund-raise primarily through pledges of donations per mile each rider completes. They may have a minimum pledge amount in addition to an entry fee to maximize the benefit to their cause.

Be sure to look ahead! Some events have entry deadlines days or weeks ahead of the ride! Check our website for updates as the season progresses; we post additions, changes, and corrections as we learn of them. That address: http://Ohio.bike

harlie Pace, who lived with enthusiasm, kindness, and infectious joy, passed away on May 15, 2021 at age 90 in Columbus, Ohio.

In 1967, as a member of Columbus Council of American Youth Hostels, an outdoor club for hikers, canoeists, spelunkers and cyclists, he volunteered to organize the Tour of the Scioto River Valley (TOSRV). The annual two-day, 210-mile tour was just five years old and during the previous year 45 cyclists showed up to begin their rides at Ohio's Statehouse.


With Charlie at the helm the tour grew exponentially. Cyclists from all over the country came to Columbus every May for this cycling rite of spring. At its peak, more than 6,000 cyclists rode the tour. And it all worked because of Charlie's skill and innovations. He developed systems to feed riders at food stops set up along the route, to find overnight accommodations, to deliver sleeping bags to their overnight locations, to arrange for Red Cross first aid stations and an emergency radio network, and to coordinate and communicate with the highway patrol and public officials as well as the volunteers who made it work.

Charlie's easy-going nature and his genuine warmth drew in hundreds of volunteers who stuffed envelopes, handed out apples and sandwiches at the food stops, drove the rental trucks full of sleeping bags, patrolled the route in radio cars, repaired bikes, and checked in returning riders.

For Charlie the work was year-round. At the moment one tour ended, he would start work on the next. Never paid for his TOSRV work over the years, Charlie's status as a volunteer never changed. He juggled all these TOSRV tasks while continuing to work as a full-time employee at Huntington National Bank, TOSRV's biggest sponsor.

TOSRV inspired dozens of big weekend bike tours that remain popular across America today. Numerous TOSRV riders from other states came back home from the tour to start TOSRV-like events in their own regions. This year's TOSRV will be the 61st edition.

Everybody loved Charlie, and because of his fun-loving approach to life, no matter how you might be feeling he brightened your day. If you ride TOSRV this year, you just might feel a little extra push from his buoyant spirit as you tackle the rolling terrain south of Chillicothe and crank up Schoolhouse Hill.










